### Fiction:

- What did you like/dislike about the book?
- Would you recommend this book? Explain your response.
- Choose a character and write about them.
- If you were to interview a character. Which questions would you ask them?
- Describe the setting in the story in your own words.
- Summarise your favourite part of the story.
- Write an alternative ending to the story.
- If you were one of the characters, what would you have done differently?
- What was the most exciting part of the story? Explain your response.
- Create an alternative setting for your story. It can be in writing, a drawing, a 3D model!
- Create a new character for the story. It can be in writing, a drawing, a 3D model.
- Create a comic strip for your story.
- Write a diary entry for your character.
- Create a story map.
- Choose an event from the story and write about how you might have acted in this situation.

### Non Fiction:

- Write some facts that surprised you,
- What have you learnt from the book?
- Find more facts to list.
- Create your own fact file thinking about layout and features required for non fiction.
- Create a quiz based on the facts you learnt in the book.
- Create an interview for a figure in your book. Think about what else you want to know or learn.
- How can you illustrate some of the facts?
- Create a glossary of words used in the book.
- Create another way to illustrate the facts you have learnt; you can show this through a comic strip, a short story, a picture.
