Nursery

Welcome to Nursery

We would like to take this opportunity to welcome all of our returning families back and to say a big 'Hello' to all of our new families. We have had a fantastic first couple of weeks of term, it is lovely to see the children settling so well into our Nursery routines well and we are very much looking forward to the year ahead.

Unfortunately, as a school we have been unable to return to our open-door policy as of yet. Whilst we do hope that this will happen soon, we would like to remind families that updates will be posted regularly on our Tapestry platform. These not only provide information on your child's learning journey, but will also give more insight into the pattern of your child's day and the type of activities on offer. If you are having any problems accessing Tapestry, please see Jane as soon as possible.

With endless possibilities, we hope that there will never be a dull moment in nursery. We work hard to ensure that there are a good range of activities available in both our outdoor and indoor areas and follow children's interests wherever possible. Currently, our children love minibeasts, and we have been enjoyed finding and observing snails, worms, spiders and even grasshoppers in our garden area. Throughout the year, we will work to help the children to develop the skills they need to think creatively, work collaboratively and problem solve. We will encourage them to develop the resilience needed to keep going when things do not work out and to have the confidence to try new things and ask questions.

At St Mary's, we strongly believe that engagement is the key to early learning. Whilst children are fully engaged in play, our team will interact with them to help them to develop a wider range of skills including numeracy, literacy, science and creative thinking. Above all, we seek to instil a love of learning in all children.

This term, we will be focusing on ensuring that the children are as settled as possible. For the first few weeks we are learning a nursery rhyme a day. Once all our new children are in, we will begin our first topic, *Why do you love me so much?* during which we will be learning about what makes us special. We will be completing a series of portraits to help develop children's creativity and thinking about our likes and dislikes, as well as how we can be a good friend to others. We will also be finding out more about our local area, learning how to care for ourselves and others and naming different emotions. We can't wait to reintroduce children to the fabulous Colour Monster books by Anna Llenas to support their learning. We will be linking our learning to our school Christian Values and establishing our class charter. In RE this term, we will begin by learning about the story of Creation and celebrating Harvest

After half term, we will learn more about Autumn, investigating the natural changes we can see in our environment. This has to be one of our favourite topics! In December we will learn about the Christmas Story.

Phonics

We have already begun to introduce many Phase 1 phonics opportunities into our daily provision. Please support us by talking to your children about what noises they can hear in the environment such as aeroplanes, fire engines, birds chirping, animal noises and at home, washing machines, buzzers, doorbells etc.

Home-learning

Please read and share stories with your child in your home language as much as possible. Look at Tapestry photos together and encourage them to discuss their experiences.

General Reminders

- **PLEASE NAME** all outdoor clothing and outer layers. Please ensure that your child has a change of clothes at nursery at all times as this makes any toileting accidents much less traumatic for them while they are settling in.
- Please provide a box of tissues if possible, you would not believe how many we go through!
- In the cold weather, please provide wellington boots and a waterproof coat as we will still be outside as much as possible.
- The school has a no jewellery policy and earrings should be studs only please. Nail polish is not allowed.
- **We would be extremely grateful for a voluntary contribution of £5 per term, to allow us to buy items for cooking and gardening with the children.**
- It would be lovely if you could send in some photographs of your family for show and tell and display to assist us with for our topic 'Why do you love me so much?' - if you are unable to print, these they can be emailed to nursery@stmarysn8.co.uk and we will print them off.
- If you are out and about in our local woods and parks, we would love more natural resources for our mud-kitchen, outdoor loose parts play and seasonal Nature Shelf – so please get collecting! Sticks, pine cones, leaves and acorns are always extremely popular resources.
